

IOSH Managing Safely Course

Course Outline

Managing Safely is for those required to manage safely and effectively in compliance with both their organisation's policy and best practice in health and safety. The Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH) accredits the course and all successful candidates receive certification.

Course Objectives

The Managing Safely syllabus covers:

- Safety management systems, the role of risk assessment and how safety management links with other aspects of management, legal requirements and the social environment.
- Reactive monitoring including which incidents have to be reported, checking that reports are being made, recording reported incidents, conducting investigations, recording results and analysing records.
- Risk assessment and risk control, including making an inventory of sources of hazards, identifying hazards associated with each course, rating risks, selecting workplace precautions and recording results of risk assessments and reviews.
- Preparing and using active monitoring checklists, implementing schedules for active monitoring, recording results and analysing records.
- Safety policy, organising and conducting a management review of the safety management system and preparing a health and safety audit.
- Identifying relevant legislation and obtaining advice and guidance on compliance.
- Managing the sources of hazards addressed in Working Safely.

Duration

Managing Safely involves around 24 hours training but can be tailored to meet your needs.

Venue
